- Danielle is still planning a trip to APS on a Friday in June or July, so if you're interested please let her know! She will try to do one every other month or so, schedule permitting.






• We have decided on the Hip Hop Stamp for the 2021 Souvenir Sheet.

Philatelic News

- July 2021 US Stamps issues (as of now):
 - Tap dance (7/10) A series of 5 stamps celebrating the unique American dance form.
 - Mystery Message (7/14) The colorful stamp contains a hidden message and will be released at the International Spy Museum in Washington DC.
 - Western Wear (7/23) A series of 4 stamps showing classic Western US articles of clothing.
 - Ursula Le Guin (7/27) Honors the award-winning science fiction and young adult author. This is a 3 ounce stamp.
 - Raven Story (7/30) The stamp depicts one of the iconic Tlingit images of Raven, an important character in Native American stories.



Collector's Corner

In May's newsletter I talked about finding 2 interesting stamps – one from Indonesia and one from India:





The one from Indonesia is Scott #771, from 1969, and is part of a series celebrating 5 Year Plans including Social Welfare, Research, Health care and Education. I thought it was interesting because the kids are not really drawn to look like most Indonesian kids.

The Indian Stamp (Scott # 846) is from 1982, and is from the series "Small Family is a Happy Family". India has been long concerned with their large population and has been urging family planning. I like how the family depicted looks like a typical "small" Indian family!

Both stamps can be the start of a topical collection!








Linn's Stamp News (6/21/21) had an article about why the self-stick US stamps are so difficult to soak off paper with just water:

After the initial launch of the 1974 Dove Weathervane Christmas self-adhesive stamp (which had all kinds of issues) the USPS dove deep into solving the problems of making a good self-adhesive stamp that would stick well but still be able to be neatly removed from the paper. The first ones using the new multi-layered paper and adhesive were released in 1989 (Eagle and Shield) and refined until the 1992 Eagle and Shield stamps, which is (pretty much) the final version.

By 2000 nearly every US stamp was self-adhering, but collectors were having major problems getting their newer stamps off of paper. The stamps were (and are) constructed using several layers of paper like so:



Notice that the soaking water should be able to get to the water-soluble layer through gaps in the ink on the stamp. This was the issue – as the USPS made more complicated and beautiful stamps more layers of ink were used, leaving less surface area for the soaking water to get through. This is why some newer stamps come off the paper easily if they have a white background, and the ones totally covered (like some of the space-topical stamps) never come off. Some of the chemicals and solutions used are really dissolving the adhesive, and again this may not leave a neat and non-sticky stamp.
