

• It is with great sadness that we announce the death of Tom Donohue. Tom was a long time member of the WCS and had recently moved into assisted living. His obituary is below:



After a several year battle with Parkinson's Disease, Tom peacefully passed away Monday, August 1, 2022 at the age of 85, at Hanna HealthCare Center, Longwood at Oakmont where he was a patient since February. Raised in Shadyside, he was the oldest child of the late Tom and Elizabeth Donohue followed by Kevin Daniel (Patricia) of North Hills and the late Mary Ann Stegman (Edward), Robert and John Donohue. After graduating from Central Catholic High School, he joined the US Coast Guard Reserves and then went to night school at Carnegie Tech to study engineering. During this period, he met and married Judy Yocca 62 years ago on August 29 and fathered 4 beloved children, Michael (Colleen), Stephen (Catherine), Paul and John. He also cherished his six grandchildren, Timothy (Kathryn), Kristen (Matthew), Luke (Jess), Patrick (Paige), Marielle (James) and Eliza and was looking forward to getting to know his five great-grandchildren. After Carnegie Tech, he was recruited to be a State Farm Insurance agent where he built a thriving business and worked for 52 years. Over the years he loved traveling, collecting stamps, hunting in the fall with friends and family, joining many events Irish, and most of all, being with family. He also never missed a note when it came to belting out his favorite

Irish songs. In 65 years, he probably never missed going to or marching with the AOH, Division 23 in the St. Patrick's Day Parade. After moving to a house in Penn Hills that is surrounded by trees, he loved the visits of deer and turkeys that would "visit".   - Connie brought in 2 large, heavy railroad locks 2 different railroads, same key. These were used to lock switch arms in place so they switches could only be operated by approved personnel.



David shared the story of his trip to Altoona last week, where they
went to the Horseshoe Curve and to the Railroad Museum. He said
that it was a great trip and highly recommends it. They also went to
the Boyer Candy Outlet Store. Other members mentioned that
Altoona is where the Subway Stamp Store is, as well as Sheetz
Store #1.

- Kris had a 1912 Rose Parade cover, with the postmark advertising the 1915 Pan Pacific Expo in San Francisco. There was also a notation for the Cal Rogers airplane flight on the front.
- Maureen had a boxed "My First Stamp Outfit" kit from 1953 that she had picked up at the Rogers Flea Market in Ohio. Stephan said that that had been his first stamp album.



- Rebecca had a UV light designed to view the tagging on new Forever Stamps. She demonstrated how the stamps look under the light.
- Bill had a cover he bought in the \$1 bin, and he was able to find that the sender was a 1916 Princeton Graduate who had gone to France to drive ambulances before joining the US Army Air Corps once we entered the war – he flew bombers. He had returned safely at wars end.
- Dave Duggins has archived past newsletters on the website going back to 2014. If you have any old newsletters you can give them to Dave for possible archiving.
- Circuits Moving forward, instead of going through circuit books at our meetings, Danielle will bring circuits to the meeting and any member can take a whole circuit home to go through and buy. #### **Philatelic News**

- September US Stamps currently scheduled for release:
  - James Webb Space Telescope (Sept. 8<sup>th</sup>) A stamp depicting the newest space telescope which has already sent back stunning new pictures of our galaxy (and more!)
  - Holiday Elves (Sept. 15<sup>th</sup>) 4 stamps showing Santa's little helpers.
  - Christmas: Virgin & Child (Sept. 22<sup>nd</sup>) The religious Christmas stamp showing a painting by a Florentine artist done in the 16<sup>th</sup> Century.
  - Charles M Schulz (Sept. 30<sup>th</sup>) 10 stamps with the cartoonist's most beloved characters.









- The USPS has announced that they have seen a one-time cash benefit from the Postal Service Reform Act of 2022. This legislation is expected to save the USPS over \$50 billion over the next 10 years. The USPS must continue to deliver mail 6 days a week and new retirees will enroll in Medicare rather than being in the USPS Retiree Health system. They are to create on online dashboard tracking delivery times. Postal rates are still expected to increase as well as having "temporary" price increases for packages this holiday season, running from October 2 January 23, 2023. (Linn's Aug. 29, 2022 & Sept. 5, 2022 and The Pennsylvania Independent May 2022)
- The USPS is still expected to buy new electric vehicles as it replaces the aging fleet. It is hoped that the first new vehicles, made in South Carolina, will be on the road by the end of 2023. (Linn's Aug. 22, 2022)
